

"Management and control of invasive plants"

The practical session took place in an area invaded by Acacia dealbata belonging to the Santo Estevão Support Centre for the Disabled, in Viseu, where the control method by "peeling" was put into practice. Invasive exotic plants have transformed ecosystems and their functions, reducing the abundance and diversity of the native

flora. Controlling invasive species requires well-planned management, which includes determining the extent of the invasion, identifying its possible causes, assessing impacts, setting priorities, the evaluating most appropriate methodologies, and subsequently monitoring the recovery of the controlled area..


Webinar "Prescribed Burning Beyond Forest Firefighting"
